



# CLIL for Secondary Teachers

## Teacher Training Course

This course gives Secondary Teachers the opportunity to explore how language instruction can be integrated into their classroom practice.

**This course offers an introduction to the Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) approach to education. It is suitable for those working in Lower or Upper Secondary Education and aims to help teachers introduce language-supportive methodologies into their teaching.**

This course is applicable for Erasmus + KA1 Staff Mobility Funding.

The course offers teachers the opportunity to collaborate with teachers from other countries.

Practical ideas for classroom management, teaching strategies, lesson planning, materials development and assessment are looked at on this course.

On this course, teachers look at different ways of guiding their students through target language content, exploring techniques and activities for providing language support when reading or listening in English.

They also look at ways to encourage and maximize students' output through English, considering different types of speaking and writing acts, and understanding the different language supports needed for each type.

Teachers also have the opportunity to explore assessment, and consider how they might approach formative and summative assessment of their students' learning, integrating assessment of subject content and language.

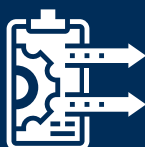
Teachers are supported in their own language development, with a dual focus on language for teaching and language for learning. Teachers explore language for interaction, language for instruction, cross-curricular academic language, and subject-specific vocabulary.



### THE MAIN AIM OF THIS COURSE IS TO HELP TEACHERS:



Develop their knowledge of the CLIL methodology at Secondary level.



Identify the language demands of their curricular subjects.



Develop and adapt materials, select digital resources and design activities to support students in their CLIL learning.



Plan and deliver CLIL lessons with confidence.

#### English Level:

Applicants to this course should have a minimum B1 level of English, as outlined in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

#### Format:

In-person training carried out in our Dublin City Centre school, delivered by our experienced teacher trainers. International classes for the dates below. Closed group can be offered at any date through the year.

#### Course Length:

20 hours in-person training + 10 hours project work

#### Course Duration:

Full time - 30 hours over 1 week. Course may be in the mornings or afternoons.

#### Final Certificate:

30 certified hours per week
