


Language, Methodology & Culture

This course is for school teachers who want to refresh and upgrade their teaching practice, while also upgrading their language skills and gaining a better understanding of contemporary Irish life and culture.



CLIL

Our Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) course is for primary and secondary school teachers who have little or no CLIL experience, but who want to know more and are aiming to teach subjects such as history, economics or science through English in the future.



Digital Transitions

This course is for teachers who want to get up to speed and stay ahead of the latest technology trends in education. You will be looking to gain a better understanding of active digital citizenship and digital literacy and be keen to learn how to incorporate these ideas into your teaching.



Sustainability and the Environment in Education

Who is this course for?

Follow up




