The event is being organised by CONUL's Staff Training and Development Group (<http://www.conul.ie/training-development/>).

The libraries of Dublin City University, Maynooth University, National Library of Ireland, RCSI [Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland], TU Dublin, University College Dublin and University of Dublin, Trinity College have come together to provide a dynamic and engaging programme of training for library colleagues under the ERASMUS scheme.

It will also include library tours of the host libraries - Dublin City University, Maynooth University, National Library of Ireland, RCSI [Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland], TU Dublin, University College Dublin and The University of Dublin, Trinity College.</p> <p>Themes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research & Open Scholarship • Customer Services • Teaching & Learning • Shaping the future • Unique & Distinct Collections and cultural heritage <p>There will be plenty of opportunities to meet staff in the participating libraries and to develop professional links.</p>

Target group	<p>Professional library staff with varied backgrounds working in universities or other research orientated libraries with an interest in sharing ideas and networking with colleagues.</p> <p>Applications are invited from library colleagues who are employed in librarianship roles (or equivalent) requiring a professional librarianship (or equivalent) qualification.</p> <p>All participants must be awarded ERASMUS Staff Mobility programme funding from their home institutions.</p>



Presentations	<p>All ERASMUS participants will be expected to provide a 10 minute presentation on one of the programme themes. To assist participants sample topics for each theme are outlined below.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <p>• Research & Open Scholarship Possible topics for presentation: Open Access; RDM; Open Data; Citizen Science; Open Educational Resources; Institutional Repositories; Open Publishing; Supporting Research Communities; Enterprise Development; and, Managing Research Proposals.</p> <p>• Customer Services Possible topics for presentation: Enhancing onsite and online services for users; innovations in service development; incorporating user voice/feedback into service design; User Experience (UX); evaluating services; equality, diversity and inclusion initiatives; green/environmental library campaigns; and, communication channels.</p> <p>• Teaching & Learning Possible topics for presentation: accessibility, trends in teaching and learning; technologies; plagiarism; digital and information literacies; learning from students; and teaching librarian roles.</p> <p>• Shaping the future Possible topics for presentation: libraries responding to trends in areas like collections, space, staff training that are shaping what the library of future might look like.</p> <p>• Unique & Distinct Collections and cultural heritage Possible topics for presentation: curatorial skills; proactive curatorial models; scholarly developments such as Digital Humanities; digitisation and digital born; enhancing access via virtual and physical exhibitions; virtual exhibition tools</p>

The applications will be assessed based on the applicant’s motivation statement, professional biography and the applicant’s own contribution to the programme (sharing ideas, best practice <i>etc.</i>).</p> <p>All applicants will be informed by e-mail by Friday 10 April 2020 as to whether their application was approved or not.</p>



Costs	Participation in the scheduled programme is free of charge. The programme includes lunch in the host institutions and one evening networking event. Other costs such as accommodation; travel to and around Dublin; and other meals are to be covered by the participants.
