The course is aimed to present, in a simple but reasoned and scientifically supported way, the graphological discipline to those (such as teachers, professional educators, tutors etc.) who deal with young people: from their handwritings they can derive solicitations and indications - possibly to be explored with the help of an expert - useful for a more profitable relationship management and a better understanding of their cognitive and behavioral dynamics.

It has to be clear that this course is not intended to qualify for the profession of graphologist, but it is an opportunity to discover the potential of the graphological tool and to become aware of what handwriting reveals.

The course is structured in modules, in order to approach in a progressive way to the subject, with a focus on the application of graphology in various fields, such as the analysis of performance and/or socialisation problems in the learning environment, the identification of aptitudes for studies and work, the vocational guidance and career advice, etc.

Aims

The course is aimed to give participants the opportunity

1. to get a broad and correctly argued view of the graphological discipline and its application, in particular those concerning young people, their needs, their discomforts, their needs for orientation to study, work, life.
2. to learn to look at handwriting as a communication tool beyond the written content.
3. to identify elements for a better management of the relationship with young people
4. to detect the possible presence of some aspects of handwriting that can represent warning signals, thus drawing attention to the needs of the individual.

Duration

The course is structured in 6 modules, for a total amount of 24 hours.

Target audience

Teachers, university professors and tutors, social workers, professional educators, trainers, tutors, etc.

Modules

Ancona

The city of Ancona, capital of the Marche region and seaport on the Adriatic Sea, is located in central Italy, about 200 km northeast of Rome and not far from Recanati, hometown of poet Giacomo Leopardi and from Urbino, Raffaello Sanzio's birthplace.

Ancona lies between the slopes of the extremities of Mount Conero and Astagno and Gvasco hills: it is the main economic and demographic centre of the region.

The seaport of Ancona is one of the most relevant on the Adriatic Sea for passengers transit.

Not far south of the city is Mount Conero, a promontory 572 metres high that is the only coastal relief on the Adriatic sea between Trieste and the Gargano massif in the region of Apulia.

The name Conero comes from the Greek name of the strawberry tree, Κόμαρος (Κομαρος), which is common on the slopes of the mountain.

Since 1987 it has been declared regional park and a nature reserve, that can be visited walking along many trails: the park also includes several archaeological/historical sites. How to reach Ancona, and how to get around the city.

Airport

Ancona is served by Airport "Raffaello Sanzio" (IATA: AOI, ICAO: LIPY), located 20 km north, in the town of Falconara Marittima. A special shuttle service connects the airport to the city centre.

Railways

The Ancona railway station is served by regional and long-distance trains.

Ancona is easily accessible by motorway: the A14 motorway serves the city with the exits "Ancona Nord" and "Ancona Sud".

Urban public transportation

The Ancona trolleybus system has been in operation since 1949. Ancona is also served by an urban bus network.

Shopping

Usually shops open:
