

Refresher Course for Language Teachers Teacher Training Course

This refresher course for language teachers focuses on Task-based teaching and learning, a learner-centred methodology which puts communicative language use at its core. Focusing on real-world tasks it provides a robust methodology that gives learners the freedom to use language communicatively and gives teachers principled techniques to work on the development of their students' language.

The course is a practical one that explores ideas, techniques and resources for language teaching and learning, where the primary focus is on the development of students' communicative competence.

Participants look at ideas for **designing engaging**, **collaborative**, **real-world tasks** to help develop students' communicative competence across all language skills, and deepen their knowledge of the target language system.

They explore the **task-based methodology** that underpins this approach and look at a framework for **developing task-based lesson plans.** They then apply the principles of this methodology to the design of engaging, collaborative tasks based around topics and texts. Teachers look at how to sequence tasks into a lesson framework and also consider how the task-based approach can be used with different student groups.

Participants consider how to **focus on language** within the communicative framework of a task-based lesson, and look at ways of ensuring their lessons **provide a good balance of opportunities** for real, communicative language use, and development of students' knowledge of language form. Throughout the course, teachers are introduced to a range of digital resources to **support students in independent study**, and in becoming lifelong language learners.



English Level:

Applicants to this course must have a minimum B2 level of English, as outlined in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

20 hours in-person training + 10 hours project work

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Project Work

Teachers are set assigned project work which they carry out after their lessons. They are set a maximum of 10 hours of project work per week, which they carry out over the week to consolidate their learning. Teachers use this time to develop their own tasks and resources, to explore the digital tools looked at in the lessons, and to prepare a mini lesson ('micro teaching') for their final day.
