This course has been designed to explore and challenge current and emerging educational methodologies. It provides a forum for teachers to explore the leading educational issues of the day in an attempt to question if we could be delivering our curriculum in an even more exciting and imaginative way.

Participants will have the opportunity to explore and investigate current research through a range of interactive and engaging activities. Current teaching methodologies will be discussed and evaluated from an academic and practical perspective.

In addition, the course will include instruction on Technology Enhanced Learning and Project Based Learning. There will be opportunities for participants to practise newly acquired skills, to create resources that enhance learning and teaching and enable their students to develop skills needed for life and work.

By the end of the course, participants will have gained insight into effective, meaningful teaching methodologies and become more familiar with the value of quality instruction supported by TEL tools and PBL. Participants will develop and share a range of teaching resources during this course.

DAY 1: WELCOME

- **S3 -** Cultural Visit: Tour of historic Derry City Walls and local places of interest.

DAY 3: USING TEL TOOLS IN THE CLASSROOM

- **S1 -** Using TEL tools. explore TEL tools that enhance the learning experience of students.
- **S2** Workshop participants will have the opportunity to consult with experts to design/develop TEL tools and resources specific to their own learning environment.
- \$3 Cultural Visit: Giant's Causeway

DAY 4: THE DEVELOPINGROLE OF PBL

- **S1 -** Overview of PBL as a partner to effective instruction.
- **S2 -** Create a PBL Plan and consolidation of key learning
- **S3** Cultural Visit: Participants will have free time to visit local points of interest at their own pace.
